## THE DOs

## When Inviting...

- Provide a personal invitation.
- Offer additional opportunities to help or ways they can use their skills, knowledge, experience.
- Provide materials with meeting dates/times or information to read.

## THE DON'Ts

## When Inviting...

- Overwhelm new members with information and lingo.
- Just invite them to a meeting at an inaccessible time.

#### When receiving...

 Ask again, even if they say no the first time. Trust in God's timing...
but also people like to feel wanted.

## When receiving...

- Host a social event or information night, so they aren't thrown into a boring meetings.
- Formation is key. You might think it is too boring, but young people are eager to learn.
- Allow new members to feel comfortable asking questions or answering, and be open to hearing

- Make them feel like they are the only one of "their kind" at the table.
- Don't talk down to new members.
- Expect them to feel comfortable asking questions or answering right away.
- Throw someone into the deep end...

#### When adapting...

• Only accommodate yourselves. If there are people able to do things

unique perspectives.

 Make them feel welcome, provide space for them to be introduced and introduce the other members.

## When adapting...

- Provide opportunities to take on responsibilities, while also providing support.
- Allow for equal opportunity.
- Ask someone what the group to do to help accommodate them.

at alternative times, give them that chance.

 Limit their opportunities to assist (i.e., recruiting young people just to help with solving computerrelated problems).
