JANUARY 2025

January 1: Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God

Today is the feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. We also celebrate that we all belong to the holy family of God which makes us brothers and sisters to each other.

March 2: Eighth Sunday of Ordinary Time

March 9: First Sunday of Lent

In today's Gospel, Jesus overcomes the temptations to wealth, power and esteem. As we begin Lent, may we open our hearts to the grace of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

March 16: Second Sunday of Lent
