



Ministry to Galley Slaves

Appointed chaplain to the French Galleys - 1619
a position he will hold for the rest of his life

Works to reform prisons

Dedicated to the Rural Poor

Organizes missions to rural poor bringing spiritual renewal and charitable aid.

Founds Ladies of Charity, Congregation of the Mission and Daughters of Charity.






The Charity Organized by Vincent

Foundling Home & Orphanages

Vincent & Louis begins work with foundlings in Louise's house January 1638. (Over 300 abandoned babies a year were saved.)

January 1640 expand the efforts, took charge of La Couche (public orphanage of Paris)










3.11 Presidents as servant leaders

Ransom of Christian Slaves in North Africa

Began mission at request of Louis XIII in 1642 Estimated population 20,000 in Algeria and 6,000 in Tunis

Congregation of the Mission acquired the French consulates in Tunisia and Algeria (1645 -1646).

Vincent's Expenses for the Orphanages

Foundlings Orphanage annually cost over \$1,600,000 to operate

Income from city 1,200 livres

Income from crown lands - 4000

Ann of Austria – 8000 from revenues of the 'great farm'





Vincent's Expenses for War Refugees

Aid to the Lorraine (1639 - 1647) over \$64 million plus food & goods

Aid to Picardy & Champagne (1650 – 1657) over \$18 million

Served hundreds of refugees in Paris





Successful Fundraiser

Aid to the Lorraine (1639 - 1647) Over \$64 million -much bravely delivered by Br. Mathieu Regnard Queen Ann loved to hear of his adventures and contributed

Received \$1,800,000 from Louis XIII

Baron Gaston de Renty took up fundraising for the cause.





Raised Funds for An Elder Hostel

Gift of \$5,000,000 by a rich burger for project of Vincent's choice.

He proposes a hostel for retired poor tradesmen & women Hospital of the Holy Name of Jesus (1654).
