

# **Reporting To Your Parish**

Being a good steward is part of the reason that Conferences are expected to provide quarterly and annual reports to the District and Diocesan Councils.

For accountability and public relations purposes, the more your parish family knows about what members of the Society are doing, the more they will support your efforts. This holds true for verbal support, monetary support and recruitment of new members. Regardless of the timing selected for these activities good stewardship calls for this to be done. It is both a Conference's responsibility and an obligation. Always keep in mind: the more your parish knows about the Society, the more they will support you.

### Recommendations on how this can be accomplished:

## A. Meetings with the Pastor

Hold short periodic meetings with your pastor on the work of the Society being performed in his parish while also promoting transparency and accountability. Ask the pastor what he feels is the best way to get the information to the rest of the parish.

#### B. Bulletin or Website Announcement

Post frequent bulletin and/or parish website announcements (when permitted) thanking the parishioners for their support and keeping them informed of services that the Society provides to those in need: number of home visits, number of families helped, number of food boxes given out, number of utility payments made, number of service hours performed by SVdP members, etc.

#### C. Flier

Create special fliers or bulletin inserts, expanding on a bulletin announcement. Timing can be important. Utilizing these may work best in conjunction with fund raisers or membership drives, weeks leading up to a parish ministry fair, or weeks of a scheduled collection for the Society. Contact your parish with your request for an insert giving them plenty of time to coordinate your timing request into their schedule.
